## Notable *Mayflower* Descendant: Gene Roddenberry of *Star Trek*

Over half a century after its creation, *Star Trek* is undoubtedly one of the most successful and recognizable multimedia franchises in history. Gene Roddenberry created the original television series about the voyages of the *Starship Enterprise* in the 1960s. Since then, the franchise has included films, television series, animated series, novels, comic books, video games, and more. The board game Monopoly has no less than three versions based on *Star Trek*, and the characters of Capt. James T. Kirk and Spock are among pop culture's most iconic duos.

Gene Roddenberry was born in El Paso, Texas, in 1921, and was raised in Los Angeles, California, where his father was a police officer. Roddenberry piloted a B-17 bomber in the Pacific during World War II; after the war, he worked for Pan American Airways. One night in 1947, Roddenberry was aboard a flight over the Syrian Desert as a deadhead (a pilot flying as a passenger and not part of the assigned crew). A fire began in one of the engines requiring the pilot to attempt a crash landing. Roddenberry initially tried to help in the cockpit. However, the pilot asked him to manage the passengers to prevent a panic. This move would save his life. After walking down the aisle reassuring passengers and instructing them on crash procedures, he sat in the third to last row and fastened his seatbelt. As the plane attempted to land with the wheels up and skidded to a halt on the desert floor, the fuselage split in two just behind the wings. Those in the front half of the plane either died upon impact or in the resulting flames, including those in the cockpit. In the back half of the plane, with two broken ribs, Roddenberry helped save trapped and injured passengers until the flames prevented further rescues. A year later, after another near crash experience, Roddenberry resigned from the airlines.

He decided to try his hand as a television writer. As he pursued his writing career, he joined the Los Angeles Police Department and became a police officer, like his father. By 1956, he had found enough success writing that he resigned from the police department to pursue writing full time, which lead to *Star Trek* a decade later. In 1985, Roddenberry became the first writer-producer to be honored with a star on Hollywood's Walk of Fame. The location of the star was a bit

nostalgic for him as it was in the same area where he had served his sergeant's probation while serving on the police force.<sup>1</sup>

Roddenberry died in 1991. A year later, some of his ashes were flown into space and returned aboard the space shuttle *Columbia*. In 1997, his ashes made a second trip into space aboard a Pegasus rocket. The ashes remained in orbit for five years before burning up in the atmosphere as the spacecraft's orbit deteriorated.<sup>2</sup> Roddenberry is credited with popularizing the exploration of space and posthumously received NASA's Distinguished Public Service Medal in 1993. The accompanying citation reads, "For distinguished service to the Nation and the human race in presenting the exploration of space as an exciting frontier and a hope for the future."

John married at Somerset 12 December 1824 (int. 20 November 1824), **CLARISSA H. MORRISON**. She was born at Somerset 20 May 1806, daughter of James and Mary (Whitwell)

Morrison. Clarissa died at Somerset 2 February 1868 and was buried there with her husband at Bourn Cemetery.<sup>12</sup>

- 8. MALINA E. BOURN, born at Somerset, Massachusetts, 8 June 1848. <sup>13</sup> She died before 18 April 1880 (spouse's second marriage). Malina married at Somerset 25 April 1873, WILLIAM WALLACE CUSHING. <sup>14</sup> He was born at Calais, Maine, 3 April 1850, son of Elijah and Eunice (Finney) Cushing. William died at Jacksonville, Florida, 13 January 1935, and was buried at Bosque Bello Cemetery, Fernandina Beach, Florida. <sup>15</sup> He married, second, at Nassau County, Florida, 18 April 1880, Mary Caroline Martin. <sup>16</sup> She was born 31 March 1861, probably at Bay City, Wisconsin, daughter of Noble Edgar and Harriet Celestia (Mills) Martin. Mary died 7 March 1911, and was buried at Bosque Bello Cemetery. <sup>17</sup> William married, third, at Sackville, New Brunswick, Canada, 6 August 1912, Sarah Eliza Avard. <sup>18</sup> She was born at Great Shemogue, New Brunswick, 7 March 1860, daughter of Joseph H. and Thomasin Spence (Dobson) Avard. <sup>19</sup> Sarah died at Jacksonville 18 January 1940 and was buried at Bosque Bello Cemetery. <sup>20</sup>
- 9. **CLARA MAY CUSHING**, born in Massachusetts 3 April 1875. She died at Jacksonville, Florida, 2 July 1917, and was buried at Folkston, Georgia, probably alongside her husband at Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery.<sup>21</sup> Clara married at Charlton County, Georgia, 20 September

1892, **LEON E. RODDENBERRY**. <sup>22</sup> He was born in Charlton County 22 March 1867, son of Henry Jackson Jr. and Novenia Adella (Sheffield) Roddenberry. Leon died at Folkston 31 October 1907 and was buried there at Bethel Methodist Church Cemetery. <sup>23</sup>

10. **EUGENE EDWARD RODDENBERRY**, born at Folkston, Georgia, 28 August 1896 or 1897. <sup>24</sup> He died at Los Angeles, California, 14 December 1969, and was buried at Rose Hills Memorial Park, Whittier, California. <sup>25</sup> Eugene married at El Paso, Texas, 3 November 1920, **CAROLINE GLEN GOLEMON**. <sup>26</sup> She was born at El Paso 3 February 1904, daughter of William Wesley and Lydia Ann (McDonald) Golemon. <sup>27</sup> Caroline died at Glendora, California, 6 May 1998, and was buried at Rose Hills Memorial Park. <sup>28</sup>

William and Malena had a stillborn son in Fall River, Mass., on 2 May 1874, eleven months before Clara's birth the following year. As no evidence of any other spouse of William Wallace Cushing has been found after 1874 and before his second marriage in 1880, Clara fits as the second (and only surviving child) of William and Malena, and the death certificate identification of Clara May (Cushing) Roddenberry's mother as "Clara M. Boling" was likely some confusion of Clara's name (or Malena's mother Clarissa) with Bourn miswritten as Boling.

11. EUGENE WESLEY "GENE" RODDENBERRY, born at El Paso, Texas, 19 August 1921.<sup>29</sup> He died at Santa Monica, California, 24 October 1991.<sup>30</sup> Gene married, first, at Kelly Field, San Antonio, Texas, 20 June 1942, EILEEN ANITA REXROAT, daughter of Frank Estes and Maude Therese (Westphalen) Rexroat.<sup>31</sup> He divorced Eileen in 1969,<sup>32</sup> and married, second, at Beverly Hills, California, 29 December 1969, MAJEL LEE HUDEC (AKA MAJEL BARRETT).<sup>33</sup> She was born at Columbus, Ohio, 23 February 1932, daughter of William Roland and Gladys Viola (Cotterman) Hudec, and died at Los Angeles, California, 18 December 2008.<sup>34</sup> Gene and Majel were originally married in a Shinto-Buddhist ceremony in Japan on 6 August 1969, however, the marriage was not legal as Gene's divorce from Eileen was not yet final. Majel Barrett was known for playing various Star Trek characters and sometimes referred to as the "First Lady of Star Trek."<sup>35</sup>
